Exchange Club Fallen Hero Tribute – September 17, 2025

Good evening fellow Exchange Club members, invited guests, and Guest Speaker.

It is both my honor and privilege to present our Fallen Hero Tribute honoring United States Army Sgt. Maj. Michael B. Stack, age 48, of Lake City, SC, who was killed on April 4, 2004, by hostile enemy gunfire. Our hero was manning a machine gun on a Humvee when his 12-man Special Forces team was ambushed while on patrol in Anbar province, Iraq.

It was Easter Sunday.

His action that day helped other members of the team survive, and he was posthumously awarded the Silver Star, the military's third highest honor for heroism in combat. He was buried with full military honors in Arlington National Cemetery.

Sgt. Maj. Stack was a father of six and grandfather of three, a career soldier who was only two years from retirement. He is remembered by his friends and family as a deeply religious man and "soldier's soldier" with a deep sense of duty.

We salute you and thank you, Sgt. Major Stack. May you rest in Heavenly peace.

Ladies and gentlemen, it is Fallen Heroes like Sgt. Major Stack who inspire this Club's Americanism Committee and many Club member volunteers to continue the proud tradition of placing American flags with yellow ribbons throughout our local communities on many Federal holidays. One of those flags honors my own grandson.
